



Ice Storm Causes Changes in Collection Schedules

Due to the ice storm, the following changes are being made to the City of Dayton's waste and recycling efforts.

- Waste collection will continue as normal. However, residents who have alley pick-up may experience some delay if alleys are blocked by downed trees, limbs or utility equipment. Crews will attempt to return for alley waste collections as soon as practical. Residents are advised to leave their containers out until crews are able to respond.
- Recycling collection will be delayed one day. As result, Wednesday recycling service will occur on Thursday, and Thursday recycling service will take place on Friday. (There is normally no Friday recycling collections scheduled.)
- Street Maintenance crews are currently engaged in removing downed trees, limbs and other debris from streets and alleys. Salt trucks are also working to salt residential streets throughout the day. Citizens should report blocked streets or alleys by calling the Public Works Call Center at 333-4800.
- Citizens who have large tree limbs or related storm debris can arrange a pick up by calling the Public Works Call Center at 333-4800. Items should be placed in a pile at the curb. Crews will be collecting the bundles over the next few weeks.
- Citizens who wish to dispose of trees limbs themselves can drop them off for free at the City of Dayton's Wagner Ford landfill (2670 Wagner Ford Road) between 8:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.
